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Workers' Compensation payment data for Fiscal Year 2011/2012 by State department is now available on the [Department of Human Resources' Web Site](#).

The State's Fiscal Year 2011/2012 total workers' compensation costs were \$571 million. This represents an increase of \$25 million from last year's costs. The State's workers' compensation costs as a percentage of total payroll increased from 3.81 percent to 3.92 percent.

The total number of open claims in June 2012 was 45,943; an increase from the 44,701 open claims in June of 2011.
