**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE
AND
CALIFORNIA STATEWIDE LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSOCIATION
REGARDING THE EXTENSION OF THE RETENTION PERIOD OF
TRANSFERS**

The purpose of the Agreement is to assist in effectuating workforce stability within the Department of Justice (DOJ), Division of Law Enforcement (DLE) and Bureau of Medi-Cal Fraud (BMFEA) and to continue to promote harmonious labor relations between the State and CSLEA.

This agreement amends article 16.4(A) subsection (3)(c)(d) and (e) to increase the retention period within DOJ from twelve (12) months to twenty-four (24) months for any voluntary transfers, new hires, reinstatements or those hired from a reemployment list. This amendment commences on July 1, 2015 and will sunset no later than July 1, 2017.

Below is the temporary amendment:

16.4 Transfers - Department of Justice


- A. Special Agents and Special Agent Supervisors**
- 3. General Criteria**
 - c. Special Agents and Special Agent Supervisors who have voluntarily transferred under this policy shall not be eligible for another voluntary transfer for a minimum of twenty-four (24) months from the effective date shown on the Request for Personnel Action (RPA).**
 - d. A request for transfer (Form DOJ 1411) may be submitted up to ninety (90) days prior to completion of the required twenty-four (24) month period.**
 - e. Special Agents and Special Agent Supervisors who are new hires, reinstatements or hired from reemployment lists, will not be eligible for voluntary transfer for a minimum of twenty-four (24) months from the date of their assignment.**






