
This Agreement represents the full and complete understanding reached by and between the parties at the conclusion of the Meet and Confer negotiations on August 1, 2016, regarding the Mental Health Crisis Bed (MHCB) Alternative Housing (AH) Program at CIM. This agreement becomes an addendum to the current State Bargaining Unit 06 Memorandum of Understanding, Article 27, Section 27.1, which expires on July 2, 2018.

1. CIM Management agrees to ensure that an identifying placard shall be prepared by non R06 staff and placed on all AH cell doors, upon placement, using existing materials and resources.
2. CIM Management agrees that if supplies are not received or issued to the AH unit, as ordered by the Housing Unit Officer, the deficiencies shall be reported through the chain of command for prompt correction.
3. CIM Management agrees to provide On the Job Training to all BU 6 staff assigned to the Alternative Housing Unit on the Alternative Housing Unit Program, using existing funds.
4. CIM Management agrees that the AH Population, with the exception of the ASU population, will be escorted unrestrained, unless directed otherwise or in accordance with Departmental Regulations.
5. CIM Management agrees to make a good faith effort to schedule normal medical appointments or treatments not conducted in the Cypress Housing Unit, to coincide with regular Facility B medical appointment and treatment times.
6. CIM and CCPOA agree the AH policy will be updated, consistent with the discussions at this meet and confer table, within 14 days and a copy will be provided to the local Chapter President or designee.


