


AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
CALIFORNIA CORRECTIONAL PEACE OFFICERS' ASSOCIATION (CCPOA)
AND
THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA,
DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION (CDCR),
MULE CREEK STATE PRISON (MCSP) REGARDING THE PRISONER OVERCOMING
OBSTACLES AND CREATING HOPE (POOCH) PUPPY/DOG PROGRAM.

This Agreement represents the full and complete understanding reached by and between the parties at the conclusion of the Meet and Confer negotiations on August 25, 2016, regarding the Prisoner Overcoming Obstacles and Creating Hope (POOCH) Puppy/Dog Program. This Agreement becomes an addendum to the current State Bargaining Unit 6 Memorandum of Understanding, Article 27, Section 27.01, which expires on July 2, 2018.

1. MCSP agrees all cells housing POOCH Program dogs shall have a 128B Informational Chrono placed on the door to include items contained in cells related to the POOCH Program.
2. MCSP agrees all post orders for Facility A, Building 2, POOCH Program will be updated no later than September 15, 2016.
3. MCSP agrees the Chapter President or designee shall be notified of all aggressive dog bites to BU 6 staff.
4. MCSP and CCPOA agrees that the POOCH Program dog vest will be marked with the dog's name, utilizing existing resources.
5. MCSP and CCPOA agree that paper placards will be placed on the cell door identifying where the POOCH Program dog is housed, utilizing existing resources.
6. MCSP agrees to provide an overview of MCSP's POOCH Program to staff working in Facility A, Building 2.
7. MCSP and CCPOA agree that Facility A, Building 2 is the designated Housing Unit for the POOCH Program dogs, primary trainers, and that MCSP will make every reasonable effort to house all participants, clustered, in Building 2.
8. MCSP and CCPOA agree during First Watch POOCH Program participants and dogs/puppies will not leave their assigned cell unless absolutely necessary (ie. for the purposes of going to the bathroom). Two Peace Officers will be present while trainer/dog are out of cell.
9. MCSP agrees absent an emergency and normal operations of the housing unit (i.e. unlocks related to POOCH) BU 6 custody staff will not be tasked with additional workload in association with POOCH Program.
10. MCSP and CCPOA agree to reopen this Meet and Confer table at the request of either party within ninety (90) days of the date of this agreement to address any unforeseen BU 6 impact issues that cannot first be locally resolved.


This Agreement may be signed by facsimile and in parts, which when all necessary signatures are obtained, shall have the same force and effect as though all signatures were executed on one document.
