The Head of Strategy/Operations/Procurement within the Office of Digital Innovation is one of four CEAs who will lead groups of employees in multi-disciplinary teams to collaborate with departments on digital services using design, technology, data and behavioral insights to deliver better services for Californians. ODI focuses on user-centered design and improving public services in California.

B. SUMMARY OF REQUEST

9. What are the duties and responsibilities of the CEA position? Be specific and provide examples.

The Head of Strategy/Operations/Procurement will be responsible for management and supervision of a multidisciplinary team of employees redirected from other state entities on a limited term basis. The CEA will define how the team is structured, staffing needs, resourcing, work planning, and resource allocation. This will include helping the team standardize their approach and tools, and provide inspiration, leadership, encouragement, and high quality standards. The CEA will also work with the Director and Chief Deputy Director to develop and communicate a clear vision and strategy for ODI, including the development and execution of business and operational planning.

Along with the Head of Engineering, Head of Product and Head of Design and User Experience, the Head of Strategy/Ops/Procurement will form strong relationships with partners in departments to help implement ODI strategies, plans and best practices.

The CEA will form strong relationships with California State control agencies to foster strategies, policies and plans that support the mission of ODI. Responsible for the planning and execution of procurement activities including procurements conducted on behalf of other departments as part of digital innovation engagements. Procurement activities will involve close coordination with other department procurement teams and/or control agencies such as the Department of Technology and the Department of General Services. The CEA will play a critical role in identifying and working through policy and potentially regulatory roadblocks impeding user-focused digital service delivery. The position will structure the approach to “discovery” for potential ODI engagements, including setting the policy and approach for conducting these diagnostic sprints. Responsible for policy around strategic planning, procurement planning and business operations. They must be able to function as part of cross-disciplinary teams, and be a strong communicator. With the Director and other Deputy Directors, the Head of Product will be responsible for establishing an inclusive culture of iterative, user-focused product development.

In partnership with control agencies, the CEA will be responsible for the formulation and implementation of various policies to support digital innovation in the State of California. The CEA will be responsible for identifying new policies, or changes to existing policies, that are needed to improve how state government applies digital innovative to meet the public’s evolving needs and enrich customer experiences. Examples of policy areas for which this CEA will have responsibilities include website design, open data, employee professional development, and procurement policies as they relate to fostering digital innovation in the State of California.

This position will be responsible for coordinating all policy development and implementation activities within the department. The CEA will work with the Head of Engineering, Head of Product and Head of Design and User Experience to set statewide digital innovation related policies. As part of this responsibility, the CEA will author new policy directives, and review and refresh existing policy that resides within the CEA’s influence. The CEA will also have the responsibility of interpreting and implementing existing policy that is currently being leveraged and used by the State of California (e.g. website Design, Open Data/Open Source and other IT, HR or procurement policies).

This is a brand new office. A part of the 2019-20 Budget Act, the Governor has proposed the establishment of ODI as a new office under GovOps with a mission to change the way California approaches service delivery and technology investments. ODI's unique purpose seeks to deliver better government services to the people of California through a deep understanding of user needs, technology, and design.

This position will supervise Strategy/Ops/Procurement Team members and other multi-disciplinary teams, act as mentor and coach, provide consistent, actionable feedback, lead recruiting and selection processes for Strategy/Ops/Procurement positions and participate in budget development by providing detailed justification and persuasive arguments for proposals or initiatives.

The CEA will provide leadership and authorship on statewide strategy and policy as they relate to Digital Innovation initiatives including research and review, ensuring alignment with vision and strategy and driving digital innovation throughout the State of California.

The CEA will work closely with the Governor's Office and the GovOps agency and other partners across state government, to ensure California is moving to prescribed objectives as they relate to civic engagement, civic participation and as better more efficient interaction with the people of California and their government.

The CEA will work closely with the Director and Chief Deputy Director to ensure that ODI's defined strategic and tactical direction is in alignment with the state's digital services and open government framework. The CEA will have a substantial responsibility in ensuring that ODI's strategic goals will be met according.
