CalHR HR Net Database	Helps state human resources professionals access information related to their jobs, such as personnel and labor relations. 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			 Upward Mobility Report provides the number of employees by classification and identifies what upward mobility category they fall into. Statewide Statistical Reports: 5102 Report provides the race/ethnicity, gender, disability, and veteran status by occupational group and classification for all state employees. 5112 Report provides the number of hires and salary advancements greater than \$1 for each race/ethnicity, gender, disability, and veteran status by occupational group and classification for all state employees. Report 2 lists all state classifications by their mapping to the Federal Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) detailed, minor, and major group name and code. Report 5 provides disability and parity deficiencies by departments with 30 or more employees.
