## PROPOSED REGULATIONS

Section 599.943 Contract Periods Bidding Process

- (a) <u>Before awarding an agreement to potential contractor Prior to the conclusion of each contract period with investment firms</u>, the <u>DepartmentCalifornia Department of Human Resources</u>

  (<u>Department</u>) shall <u>comply with the state's competitive bid process that shall-offer provide all qualified bidders with a fair opportunity to participate in enter the bidding process. and to follow state contracting best practices tTo the extent feasible, the Department will utilize the the following public bidding procedures: in order be used to select the firm to be awarded the new contract. Such process shall be undertaken at least every five calendar years.</u>
  - (1) <u>Post the bid publicly through the departmental public announcement, industry related national association and national publication web pages.</u>
  - (2) <u>Provide instructions, including the application deadline and process, for prospective bidders to apply through the contract procurement webpage.</u>
  - (3) Avoid unnecessary restrictions to competition.
  - (4) <u>Follow predetermined procedures developed in compliance with applicable laws to ensure fair competition.</u>
  - (5) Review and evaluate bidder responses to select the contract awardee.
  - (6) Publicly announce the contract winner on the department's announcement web page.
  - (7) <u>Finalize the contract based on the solicitation specifications and the contractor's response.</u>
- (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) above, the Department may utilize a non-public bidding process if deemed necessary to maintain the continuity of services and if it is in the best interest of the Plan,

as determined by the Department and on a case-by-case basis. The Department will follow all public bidding processes except for publicly announcing and awarding the solicitation under subsections (a)(1), (a)(2), and (a)(6). Additionally, the Department will work with contracted consultants to source through a diverse set of firms and notify potential bidders of the upcoming request for a proposal.
