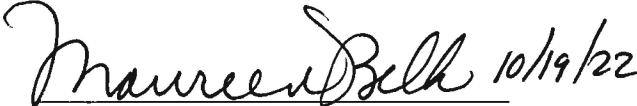
This Agreement represents the full and complete understanding reached by and between the parties at the conclusion of the Meet and Confer negotiations on October 19, 2022, regarding the statewide California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Division of Adult Institutions, and the California Correctional Health Care Services Statewide Mental Health Program implementation of the Specialized Bed Complete Care Model (SBCCM). This agreement becomes an addendum to the current State Bargaining Unit 6 Memorandum of Understanding, Article 27, Section 27.01, which expires on July 2, 2023.


1. The parties agree that BU6 employees will not be required to track Specialized Bed Complete Care Model (SBCCM) huddle attendance or fill out the Specialized Bed Huddle Report.
2. The parties agree that the Specialized Bed Complete Care Model (SBCCM) Hand-Offs between shifts shall occur between custody staff assigned to the unit.
3. The parties agree that within thirty (30) days from the date of implementation, the CCPOA Chapter President and one (1) designee will be released for one (1) day on Official Business for a local Meet and Discuss at the six (6) identified institutions (COR, SAC, SVSP, CIW, CMF, CHCF) to discuss the post orders and Local Operational Procedures related to the Specialized Bed Complete Care Model implementation.
4. The parties agree that within ninety (90) days of the SBCCM program implementation at the last CDCR institution, either party may request to reopen this table to address any unforeseen impact issues that cannot be resolved locally.
5. The parties agree that as the rollout schedule for each SBCCM program is identified for institutions statewide (excluding CIW, CHCF, SAC, SVSP, COR and CMF), the local CCPOA Chapter President or designee may request a local meet and discuss to review the local Operating Procedures related to the change. The local CCPOA Chapter President and one (1) designee will be released on Official Business (OB) for one (1) day.

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6. The parties may request to reopen this table to discuss and negotiate any unforeseen BU6 workload impact. This reopener will expire ninety (90) days from the date the SBCCM program is rolled out and implemented at the last CDCR institution.
7. The parties agree that prior to the SBCCM implementation at an institution, available and regularly assigned BU6 staff, including RDO/Relief, who work in a specialized bed unit will be provided instructor-led OJT utilizing existing funds, materials, and resources. SBCCM OJT will be provided to BU6 staff not assigned to a specialized bed unit at local management's discretion.
8. The parties agree BU6 members who attend the SBCCM huddle will be required to include their title on the SBCCM attendance sheet. The local chapter president may request a copy of the SBCCM attendance sheet from the LRA locally.

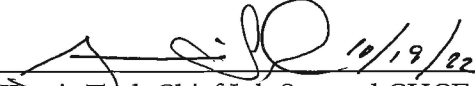

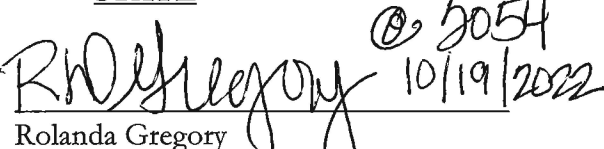
