Subject: WORKERS' COMPENSATION COST DATA, FISCAL YEAR 1989-90

Enclosed is the workers' compensation cost data (Exhibit A) for all of State Government for the period July 1, 1989 to July 1, 1990. The most telling statistics, as compared to the previous year, are:

- o Workers' Compensation costs represent 2.64% of payroll. This is a 3.44% DECREASE over Fiscal 88-89.
- o Industrial Disability Leave costs rose 3.18% over Fiscal 88-89.
- o Total costs rose 12.93% over Fiscal 88-89 and now amount to \$193,141,389.

A separate exhibit (Exhibit B) has been enclosed which lists in descending payment order the costs of all departments who spent over \$1,000,000 during the 89-90 Fiscal Year. These 25 departments account for 95.73% of all expenditures.

For the first time, medical costs have been separately listed. These costs, which constitute the fastest growing segment of the State's workers' compensation expenditures, amount to \$75,393,387 or 39.04% of all payments.

Since the transfer of the unit to DPA staff has been reviewing on a monthly basis the Health and Safety & Workers' Compensation programs of a wide range of state departments. A pattern of deficiencies has been noted in most of them and it is our belief that similar patterns exist in many other departments. The following key issues should be areas of concern for all departments:

o Management must become more involved in health and safety programs.

Until and unless management of a department exerts a leadership role in these programs they will remain a low priority in the department and will never be truly effective.

o The Health and Safety staff must monitor and control the outlying parts of their department.

Having an effective program in headquarters is appropriate but in many cases the "action" is out in the field. The department's coordinator must have the authority and the responsibility to effect change as appropriate statewide.

o Greater emphasis must be placed on preventing injuries.

The reverse side of SCIF Form 3067 State-the Employers Report Of Occupational Injury or Illness-is the key to preventing injuries from recurring. The Supervisor must critically review the injury that has just occurred and provide concrete suggestions on what must be done to prevent it from happening again.

o Injuries must be reported in a timely manner.

Delays in reporting lead to delays in benefit provision and imposition of penalties under the new Labor Code provisions. Departments should take steps to report all claims to State Fund within 5 days after they occur.

o Greater emphasis must be placed on "Return to Work" Programs.

One of the most effective means available to all departments to control their costs, is to return employees to limited or modified duty as soon as possible. Statistics show that the longer employees remain off work the more costly the claim becomes. Conversely, the quicker employees return to work the less expensive the claim becomes. Departments should work closely with their employees, the State Fund and the treating doctor so they may return employees to work as soon as it is medically feasible.

As managers, supervisors and workers' compensation personnel review the data (and the data for the 87/88 & 88/89 fiscal years which was contained in the PML of September 6, 1990) we recommend that the following three factors be kept in mind:

Each department is unique. To try and compare costs on either an absolute or comparative basis will not be of any value in either understanding a department's present status or in implementing corrective action in order to bring the cost under greater control. Each department should only look at and analyze its own data, their own trend line over the years. This is the only valid comparison that can and should be made.

- The primary, and most effective, means a department can use to better control these costs is by implementing or revitalizing its Injury Prevention Program. (Labor Code Section 6401.7 and Title 8, CCR, Section 3203 et seq.) - o The next most effective means a department can use to control these costs is by exerting close management control of the claims once they occur, including returning disabled employees to work as soon as it is medically feasible. To obtain assistance in these processes, please contact Sondra Cooper of my staff on (916) 327-1839 or ATSS 467-1839.

Unless a department commits itself to providing a safe and healthful place to work and returning its employees to work at the earliest possible moment, its costs will only continue to rise.

Subject: Bargaining Unit 14 Terms and Conditions of Employment

Attached are the terms and conditions of employment that will be effective March 1, 1992 for Bargaining Unit 14 employees. These statewide policies replace the provisions of the recently expired 1988-91 Bargaining Unit 14 MOU. Please share this information with your managers, supervisors, and employees and take all necessary actions to implement these policies on the above date.

The State will implement these terms and conditions of employment based on the rulings of the Sacramento Superior Court. First, where a Government Code or Department of Personnel Administration Rule exists relative to a provision in the expired MOU, the State must implement the provisions of the Code or Rule. Second, the State's proposed reductions of economic benefits (compensation and benefit reductions) will not be implemented pending successful judicial appeal and/or action by the Legislature. Third, there are several union benefits that have already been discontinued and that status will remain unchanged. These include union leave, maintenance of membership, fair share fees, and arbitration.

Please keep in mind that these terms and conditions may change based upon the State's appeal of the Superior Court's rulings or if there is Legislative action. We will keep you apprised of any such occurrences.

Our matrix attempts to highlight any changes from the recently expired 1988-91 MOU resulting from the Court's orders to implement existing Government Codes or Rules. The various terms and conditions of employment are listed in the same sequence as reflected in the expired MOU for your convenience. Implementation of the above-referenced terms and conditions of employment constitutes the completion of the 1991-92 negotiations.
