9. What are the duties and responsibilities of the CEA position? Be specific and provide examples.

Strategic Communications and External Affairs Departmental Support

The Assistant Deputy Director will play a key role in supporting the Deputy Director in the execution of GO-Serve's communications and external affairs strategy, ensuring alignment with the Governor's Communications and External Affairs Offices. This includes coordinating media relations, public messaging, and external engagement efforts across GO-Serve's programs. As a key support to the Deputy Director, the Assistant Deputy Director helps manage day-to-day team operations, ensuring alignment across GO-Serve's entities and leadership. Facilitates cross-team coordination, tracks key initiatives, and reinforces the Deputy Director's strategic direction, ensuring that communication efforts and external engagements reflect GO-Serve's priorities and vision.

External and Legislative Affairs

Support the Deputy Director in leading external relations and stakeholder engagement for GO-Serve, working closely with state agencies, elected officials, legislative offices, local governments, commissions and community partners. This includes developing and implementing outreach initiatives, public affairs campaigns, and legislative engagement strategies. Advise the Deputy Director, leadership and GO-Serve, YEC, CV, and OCPSC staff on external affairs and legislative affairs as needed.

Communications and Digital Media

Support the Deputy Director on strategy, media relations, and branding to ensure GO-Serve's communications and messaging aligns with agency priorities. Advise the Deputy Director, leadership and GO-Serve, YEC, CV, and OCPSC staff on digital media, media engagement and public messaging. The role includes reviewing and refining communications materials ranging from video and graphic design to press releases, talking points, and reports to ensure clarity and consistency.

Coordination Duties

Ensure public activities are aligned with the GO-Serve's mission, priorities, and long-term objectives. The position will also be responsible for tracking communications and external affairs priorities, preparing internal reports, and managing plans and timelines for strategic initiatives. Additionally, the role will require occasional travel and participation in key meetings, briefings, and stakeholder events to represent GO-Serve's interests.

Administrative Duties

Provide high-level administrative and operational support to the Deputy Director, managing the execution of communications and external affairs functions across Communications and External Affairs teams at YEC, CV, and OCPSC. This includes managing internal communications, coordinating cross-agency efforts, project management, overseeing special projects, and supporting executive decision-making through research, analysis, and recommendations.

GO-Serve elevates paid service and volunteerism in the state, promotes more youth and community engagement, and advances public awareness and outreach campaigns to tackle the state's most pressing challenges. The growth of the agency's initiatives, increasing public engagement, and complex external eletions demand additional expertise and strategic coordination. This new position is lesigned to enhance our ability to manage both internal and external communication functions more effectively, ensuring that GO-Serve continues to meet its mission and engage with its stakeholders in a cohesive and impactful way. This role will support the Communications and External Deputy Directo to ensure that the agency's messaging is consistent, clear, and aligns with organizational objectives. Additionally, the position will focus on building and nurturing long-term relationships with key external partners, fostering trust and collaboration.

Establishing the new state agency of GO-Serve ensures greater stability, continuity, and institutional capacity compared to relying solely on appointee positions. Appointees often serve at the discretion of elected officials, leading to potential disruptions with changes in administration, while a state agency staffed by civil service employees provides long-term, professionalized leadership and expertise.

Additionally, a dedicated agency can more effectively manage the growing scope and complexity of statewide service programs, ensuring consistent implementation, accountability, and the ability to adapt to evolving public needs.

The Communications and External Affairs Assistant Deputy Director will support policies around AB 540 CA Dream Act (AB 540), which is sensitive and controversial in nature. Immigration is a highly politicized issue and policies like AB 540 may face opposition who advocate for stricter immigration laws. Debates about immigration can spark strong emotions and trigger divisive rhetoric leading to controversy in public discourse and media coverage. Some against AB 540 may argue that providing in state tuition benefits to undocumented students under AB 540 places a financial burden on taxpayers or takes away resources from educational priorities. Opponents of AB 540 may raise legal concerns about providing benefits to undocumented immigrants arguing that it violates federal immigration law or undermines the principles of fairness and equality. Disputes over legality of state level policies and benefits can lead to contentious debates in the legislature, courts, and media.

For the Communications and External Affairs Assistant Deputy Director, supporting the navigation these sensitive and controversial aspects of the AB 540 bill requires careful communication strategic messaging and an understanding of the diverse perspectives and interests involved. They will advise senior and executive staff, implement communications strategies and train and mentor other staff.
